His career history includes four years working at the Pentagon on defense plans and as a

policy analyst. In his spare time and for fun, Matt also volunteers for Colorado's National Guard Emergency Response Force which has sent him to Afghanistan and New Orleans, and had him working the 2008 DNC.
